We wish to extend a cordial invitation to you to attend the 35th ADMSEP Annual Meeting at the Sheraton Harborside in Portsmouth, NH. Each year attendees include clerkship directors in psychiatry, course directors of pre-clinical courses, and other faculty members who are interested in medical student education. The meeting dates are **June 18-20, 2009**.

The program will be educational, stimulating, and fun with plenary sessions, workshops, poster sessions and plenty of time for networking and talking with colleagues. Our Keynote speaker will be **Öæ!|/AÖS&ÖU!^•ä^} öæ ä ÖÖUÖÖÖ ÖÖÖ**. Our distinguished special speaker will be Dr. Linda Pessar who will speak on the topic of "Exploring Mental Life through Art."

We are excited to announce this year's pre-meeting (June 18) will include the "NBME Test Item Writing" seminar (lead by Senior NBME Staff), but there is a seating limit of 30, so we encourage interested persons to register as soon as possible. For the relatively new faculty member to medical student education, you are encouraged to come early and participate in the pre-meeting workshop "Toolkit for Early Career Educators." Lecturing tips, enhancing course materials, getting started in educational research and developing your educational portfolio are some of the topics

The meeting's plenary themes include innovations in clerkship design, research in psychiatric education, stigma in psychiatry, and surviving disaster. Poster and workshop themes include new approaches to teaching neuroscience, development and utility of new teaching technologies, the longitudinal curriculum and other reforms, Shelf performance correlations, use of media and entertainment modalities to enhance teaching, transitions in course leadership, teaching medical students motivational interviewing skills, writing for publication, and collaboration with other disciplines. NBME staff will also discuss the Psychiatry Subject Exam (Shelf) and receive audience critique. See the attached preliminary program for further detail.

We will continue our new tradition with the second annual poster competition—and we will have one of our largest poster sessions ever with at least 16 posters, including one from PsychSIGN!

On that web page, you will notice that you may now pay meeting registration and/or membership fees electronically. However, if you prefer a paper based form, they are still available and one is attached. In order to qualify for the meeting's advance registration rates, the registration must be received by May 18, 2009.

Portsmouth, a historic seaport settled in 1623 and popular summer tourist destination, was named one of the Dozen Distinctive Destinations by The National Trust for Historic Preservation in 2008, for its "stimulating mix of historic buildings, sidewalk cafes, great restaurants, art galleries, jazz clubs and distinctive artisans' boutiques." Besides the usual array of golf courses and shopping venues, Portsmouth and the surrounding area has something for everyone! Revolution era history enthusiasts will enjoy the American Independence Museum which sits at the site of the New Hampshire Treasury during the American Revolution, as well as the Albacore Museum. For those interested in more general New England history, the Strawberry Banke Museum offers a historic view of early New England life with restored homes and historic artisans; and the Moffatt-Ladd House, a National Historic Landmark' is one of America's finest Georgian mansions, built for merchant John Moffatt between 1760 and 1763.

Those who are wishing to escape the hectic pace of academic medicine will enjoy Hampton Beach or a walk through Prescott Park. The Great Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve has an education center, and the history filled Isles of Shoals is a picturesque and wonderful day excursion, just 6 miles off the coast of New Hampshire. The Seacoast Science center, located on Point Odiome where settlers first landed, offers extensive programs and exhibits in marine education. Several lighthouses remain in the area for those who enjoy nautical history. Tugboat tours, harbor tours, and whale watching trips are all available, and for the more adventurous souls, check out sea kayaking rentals or deep sea fishing charters. Anyone bringing a family will find much to explore, with the Children's Museum of Portsmouth, time at Water Country (a water park) and the York Animal Kingdom, which is the largest zoo and amusement park in the Seacoast. Also going on in a nearby town is the Somersworth International Children's Festival on Saturday June 20.

The weather can't get much better than what is typical in June in Portsmouth, NH, with a normal average of 66°F, and a normal high of 78°F, and a normal low of 53°F.

There are many ways to reach the destination of Portsmouth for the 35th Annual ADMSEP meeting as it is served by several nearby airports, the major ones being Manchester-Boston Regional (48 miles away) and Logan International in Boston (65 miles away).
