Other Interests: Hiking, reading (especially non-fiction and true crime), watching cooking shows and convincing myself I could actually make the dishes better (but really, I probably can't).

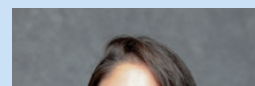
Why I joined ADMSEP: Because I do whatever Tony Miller tells me to!

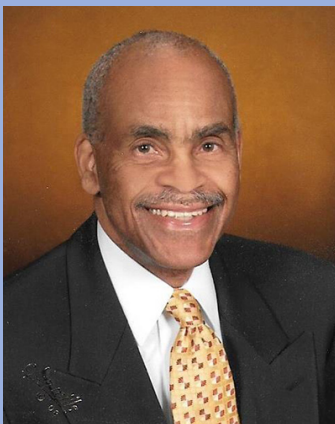

Based on the award-winning Model Psychopharmacology Curriculum for Residents and in collaboration with the Association of Directors of Medical Education in Psychiatry (ADMSEP), the fifth edition Model Psychopharmacology Curriculum for Medical Students, Primary Care

Residents/Mental Health Clinicians was created for residents and practicing primary care physicians. The Medical Student curriculum was created for either basic science education or to the junior clerkship, a comprehensive lecture on the ethics of physician/industry interactions, and a complete course in substance abuse psychopharmacology.

The curriculum includes an introduction, rationale, and objectives for developing, teaching, and evaluating a psychopharmacology curriculum. The curriculum focuses on the basic understanding of psychotropic medications and conditions they treat, along with dosing and therapeutic information. The 20 lectures cover the general background of a particular diagnostic area as an introduction to the basics of psychopharmacologic treatment. The core lectures cover clinical psychopharmacology on topics to primary care and medical students including the art of psychopharmacology, therapeutic alliance in pediatric psychopharmacology, evaluation and managing side effects of psychiatric medications, and psychopharmacology warnings and management. There is also a 16 lecture substance abuse supplement. Objectives and pre and post-test questions are included in most lectures. Special features have been added, including recommendations of outstanding texts, journals, and web sites.

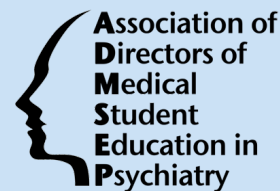
